Anderson College of Nursing and Health Professions

The Anderson College of Nursing and Health Professions (ACONHP) has served as a leader in the education of nurses since 1973. The ACONHP is fully approved by the Alabama State Board of Nursing and fully accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE). The ACONHP is ranked in the top 10 most up-and-coming nursing programs in the South and boasts superior state and national certification pass rates across all programs. The ACONHP strongly supports UNA's role as Alabama's Workforce Development University and is committed to producing the highest quality nursing and health professionals in the state.

- Due to a generous gift by Ms. Jenny McKinney, the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program was renamed to the "Florence Helen Nethery Duncan Bachelor of Science in Nursing program."
- For undergraduate Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) students, the 2022 NCLEX first attempt pass rate is 95 percent. The Alabama Board of Nursing requires at least 80 percent or higher.
- For Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) Family Nurse Practitioner students, the 2022 graduates achieved a pass rate of 98 percent for all test takers.
- The Doctorate of Nursing Practice (DNP) launched in Spring 2023 as UNA's third doctoral degree program. The first DNP cohort contains 13 students from across the state of Alabama.
- The Psychiatric-Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP) track launched in Spring 2023.
- In Fall 2023, the new Post-Master's Certificate Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMC-PMHNP) track will be offered entirely online with two on-campus intensives.
- In Summer 2023, the Florence Helen Nethery Duncan Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Program will admit approximately 24 students to the newly structured Accelerated Bachelor of Science in Nursing (ABSN) track. This Summer, for the first time, the delivery modality will change from a fully face-to-face to a hybrid format. Students will complete all coursework online and come to the Shoals area to complete clinical rotations two to three weekends a month.
- 100 percent of Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) and RN to BSN graduates completed an experiential learning opportunity with a registered nurse in a practice setting.
- 100 percent of Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) and Post-Master's Certificate (PMC) graduate students completed experiential learning opportunities in an appropriate practice setting.
- Traditional BSN students completed an interprofessional collaborative simulation with North Alabama Medical Center medical residents and ACONHP respiratory care faculty.
- 100 percent of MSN Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) students graduating in Fall 2022 completed a high-fidelity

- simulation in which traditional BSN students served as standardized patients.
- 100 percent of MSN Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) students completed a poverty simulation.
- Apple 1-to-1 initiative: Students entering the Florence Helen Nethery Duncan Bachelor of Science in Nursing Pre-licensure track in the Anderson College of Nursing and Health Professions in the Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 semesters received an iPad preloaded with apps to assist them in their coursework on the first day of classes. Students use the preloaded apps in the classroom for quizzing and polling, whiteboard features, and real-time documentation of patient information in the simulation center.

I've spent the last twenty years working in healthcare. I am currently pursuing a Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) degree with a concentration in Population Health. I have been fortunate to share a long history with the UNA. As a 2017 Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) and 2019 Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) graduate, I easily

recognized UNA as the ideal university to obtain my next degree. The instructors at UNA have a great understanding of the barriers that exist for working professionals. They provide clear expectations, offer great flexibility, and provide student-specific guidance throughout their programs. When I think about my time at UNA, there are so many aspects to reflect on fondly. I am currently employed as the Associate Chief Nurse for Operations at the Tuscaloosa Veterans Affairs Medical Center. One of my responsibilities is oversight of our Infection Prevention Program. I started my role just a few weeks before COVID-19 cases started showing up around the globe. Although I had extensive experience with infection prevention, I recognized I needed to continue to grow in my profession to effectively navigate the challenges associated with COVID-19. After just two months into my first semester, I have already learned so much that I can directly implement into my nursing practice.

College of Arts, Sciences, and Engineering

The largest of UNA's colleges, the College of Arts, Sciences, and Engineering (CASE), plays a critical role in preparing UNA's students for life beyond campus. Made up of 18 departments offering nearly 100 majors and 11 graduate degrees, CASE is committed to offering outstanding educational opportunities alongside innovation and workforce development from the associate to the graduate level. Looking ahead, CASE remains critical to advancing UNA's role as Alabama's Workforce Development University and ensuring student success, both before and after graduation.

- CASE is home to UNA's new Associate of Science degrees (Culinary Arts, Hospitality and Events Management, and Mechatronics), which will launch in Fall 2023.
- The engineering program at UNA has undergone transformative change and now offers programs of study ranging from a micro-credential to a master's degree in Applied Manufacturing Engineering. Power Generation has been added as a new option in the BS in Engineering Technology degree program and will begin in Fall 2023.
- CASE's commitment to workforce development and smart enrollment strategies has led to significant growth in the online graduate programs in Social Work, Criminal Justice, Mathematics, and Writing.
- CASE will host eight faculty-led education abroad programs planned for Summer 2023.
- Nine CASE faculty members developed courses as part of UNA's Open Education Resources (OER) initiative to replace traditional high-cost textbooks and course materials. These proposals alone are projected to save students almost \$200,000 per year.
- The North Alabama Public Service Training Center opened with the aim of serving and collaborating with local, regional, and statewide public service agencies. The Center supports training, education, and research for public service leaders and employees, including law enforcement departments, fire departments, and other emergency services.
- Faculty in the Criminal Justice program received a grant from the Alabama Commission on Higher Education to support a Summer bridge program (Operation Fast Start/ UNA Justice Academy) designed to foster retention and completion while building a sense of community.
- Several CASE faculty members completed a sixweek Inclusive STEM Teaching Project offered by Boston University and sponsored by the National Science Foundation. The program was designed to advance awareness, self-efficacy, and the ability of STEM faculty to cultivate inclusive learning environments for all their students.

College of Education and Human Sciences

The College of Education and Human Sciences (COEHS) has a long history of distinction, dating back to UNA's founding in 1830. It remains dedicated to the outstanding preparation of its graduates in education, health, and wellness, who go on to lead the state and beyond, improving the lives of all impacted. COEHS is uniquely positioned to advance UNA's Workforce Development initiative through its relationships with Alabama's schools.

As Alabama faces a historic teacher shortage, COEHS is a state leader in teacher production. Its innovative programs, at both the graduate and undergraduate levels, leave COEHS well-positioned for future growth and to support the development of the state and region. COEHS alumni return to their communities, benefiting from the exceptional training they receive at UNA, moving Alabama forward through the transformative power of education.

- COEHS is the 5th largest producer of teachers in Alabama (out of 25), adding approximately 150 teachers annually to Alabama schools.
- 95 percent of COEHS teacher alumni remain in the state of Alabama as teachers benefiting the children of Alabama.
- COEHS's teacher education program continues to grow, and 100 percent of its graduates find jobs in their field.
- Kilby Laboratory School continues its tradition of excellence and was ranked at No. 1 in the Best Public Elementary School Teachers in Alabama category for 2022-2023, according to a national education research group. As the only laboratory school in the state, Kilby allows UNA students preparing to be teachers an unparalleled opportunity for direct, hands-on engagement and observation of current practicing teachers through clinical experiences.
- COEHS hosted the first annual Alabama Higher Education Science of Reading Symposium, bringing teachers from across the state to share research, best practices, and ideas for supporting pre-service and in-service teachers.
- The Department of Kinesiology master's and doctoral programs remain highly enrolled, and the first doctoral student in Exercise Science and Health Promotion graduated Spring 2023. This department also launched the Sport and Recreation Management 'flex' option, offering a 100 percent online BS degree catering to current adult workers/practitioners.
- The MS in Instructional Technology and Design launched in Fall 2021 and has seen tremendous growth of 170 percent. Its first graduates have joined the UNA alumni family.
- COEHS and fifty-three LEAD (Leading Educators to Advanced Degrees) partnerships with schools and districts across Alabama assist current teachers in obtaining advanced degrees and credentials.
- Growth in LEAD student enrollment directly translates into classroom success for Alabama students. UNA continues to add new districts to this program.
- The College of Education and Human Sciences conducted

- over 50 student-led research projects, resulting in student-authored publications and presentations, some of which received external funding.
- Beyond Alabama, international collaboration continued, and the first group of STEM education students from South Korea will graduate in the coming year.
- Accreditation remains a crucial component of excellence in COEHS. All education programs are approved by the Alabama State Department of Education.
- Initial and advanced preparation programs have full accreditation through the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP).
- The Counselor Education program earned accreditation from the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs, as did the Clinical Mental Health Counseling program and the School Counseling program.

 Authority (SEDA) in partnership with the Center for
 Learning and Professional Development to fund the
 first cohort of Code Alabama. Code Alabama is an
 eight-week workforce development initiative certificate
 program that trains programming competency.
 Code Alabama was implemented in Spring 2023.

things makes the program great to go through. I'm getting the same quality of education that I would get if I were sitting in a classroom.






- The Cole Honors College is experiencing significant growth, from 630 students in Fall 2021 to 753 students in Fall 2022.
- Enrollment is projected to reach 850 in 2023 approximately 15 percent of the undergraduate UNA population.
- Honors College students participated in research and internship opportunities at Duke University, University of California-Berkeley, Hudson Alpha, NASA, Southern Power, U.S. Senate, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, TVA, Redstone Arsenal, and many other entities and organizations.
- The Honors Mentor Program pairs an incoming firstyear student with a current Honors student to guide the important transition to college life. All Cole Honors College student mentors received education and training from the Mitchell-West Center for Social Inclusion.
- The partnership between the College and the Office of International Affairs has resulted in greater student engagement with education abroad and study-away opportunities.
- The College partnered with SCOBT for the first-ever Honors education abroad trip to Ireland (Summer 2023).
- The College developed and launched the new Honors College Global Learning Badge (a LinkedIn verified certification).

OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

UNA's Office of International Affairs has continued its tradition of excellence in promoting internationalization on UNA's global campus. In 2022-2023, International Affairs recruited and served the highest number of international students at UNA in the last 10 years. Graduate international enrollment more than tripled pre-pandemic numbers and international undergraduate enrollment more than doubled in that same period. These students bring value-added diversity of global cultures, thoughts, perspectives, and experiences. Additionally, International Affairs has implemented numerous opportunities to allow international students to celebrate their own culture and teach other students about it-preparing all students for the global marketplace of today and tomorrow.

- The Office of International Affairs recruited and served 932 international students from 69 countries—the largest group in the past ten years.
- International online enrollment more than doubled from pre-pandemic Fall 2019 to Fall 2022.
- In collaboration with CASE and other campus constituency groups, UNA launched the Guizhou-UNA International College of Engineering and Technology in China, offering three bachelor degrees in Engineering Technology, Occupational Health Science, and Sustainability with over 200 students currently enrolled.
- International Affairs established ten new global partnerships with universities in Costa Rica, France, Hungary, China, India, Korea, Spain, and Mexico, and established three international feeder school partners in Guatemala and Costa Rica.
- UNA's Education Abroad program has been rebranded as UNA Global Learning and incorporates various aspects of global learning, including Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL) and Education Abroad. COIL allows UNA faculty to partner with faculty at institutions abroad, allowing students to participate in a global learning community without leaving home. Additionally, over a dozen Education Abroad programs are scheduled for Summer 2023, in which UNA students learn about a new culture while simultaneously experiencing it.

UNIVERSITY SUCCESS CENTER

The University Success Center's mission is to assist students in developing the personal and academic knowledge, skills, and abilities necessary for student success. The University Success Center includes University Advising Services, the UNA Career Center, the Center for Writing Excellence, and Academic Testing Services

 The Success Center implemented Tutor.com in Fall 2021. Tutor.com provides on-demand online tutoring services in a multitude of disciplines for all students. Services are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week to provide access to tutoring services without regard to time zone or location.



- From implementation in Fall 2021 to Fall 2022, over 5,000 total sessions have been completed by 993 individual students.
- 98 percent of UNA students recommend this service.
- Fall 2021 to Spring 2022 retention: Higher retention rate for users (88 percent) than non-users (83 percent).
- Fall 2021 to Spring 2022 retention for students on Academic Standing: Higher retention rate for users (85 percent) than non-users (70 percent).
- Fall 2021 to Fall 2022 retention: 71 percent retention rate for users vs. 69 percent for non-users.
- Fall 2021 to Fall 2022 retention: 68 percent retention rate for users vs. 56 percent for non-users.
- Fall 2021 to Fall 2022 retention of online students: 73 percent retention rate for users vs. 67 percent for non-users.
- Average student rating, 4.69/5, for Tutor.com services.
- The UNA Career Center is entering its third year of partnership with the Alabama Commission on Higher Education (ACHE) in its Retain Alabama initiatives, with year three focusing primarily on experiential learning opportunities throughout the state.
- The Career Center completed a campus-wide implementation of resume review software V Mock, to provide resume writing feedback and assistance to students in real-time.

COLLIER LIBRARY + OER Integration

- The Digital Press at Collier Library continues to expand. Six books have been completed (with six more awaiting publication by Fall). Currently, each book is used as a free textbook to save money for students. Additionally, graduate classes have begun using the platform to collaborate as authors and editors for an original book as their final project. The Digital Press was introduced in late Spring 2022 and has seen tremendous growth throughout its existence.
- Educational Technology Services (ETS) has worked with Collier Library to offer development for Open Educational Resources (OER). Since June, ten OER developments have begun. These new OER projects for 2022 bring total student textbook savings to approximately \$800,000.
- Collier Library and Information Services continues expanding its app offerings for laptops, tablets, and mobile device users. Collier Library now offers an array of applications that enhance discoverability, research, and the use of information outlets on the Internet. App usage among library users (faculty, staff, and students) has risen monthly. Apps are integrated into library instruction and communication.
- Collier Library has joined a library cooperative for 24/7 chat access. This service allows on-demand assistance 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and is crucial for our distance learning and international collaboration students. When Collier Library isn't open, library staff from across the world aid in assisting its users. The conversations are relayed to Collier Library faculty and staff so they may follow up and further assist our learners and users with their information inquiries.

A lot went into my decision to select UNA. For one, the pandemic played a part. UNA offers an all-online program but is close enough that I could physically visit professors or my advisor if needed. - Significantly, UNA signed an agreement with the U.S.
 Office of Personnel Management to become part of
 the Federal Academic Alliance, placing UNA among
 fewer than 30 higher education institutions in the
 country to offer a tuition scholarship to more than two
 million employees of the federal government. Doing so
 allows UNA to provide federal employees worldwide
 with access to high-quality educational options that are
 both affordable and flexible.
- From 2022-2023, UNA has added multiple new partners, including Nucor Steel and Southern Company.
- Enrollment resulting from university partnerships increased 61 percent from Fall 2021 to Fall 2022 and 60 percent from Spring 2022 to Spring 2023.

ENROLLMENT MANAGEMENT

As an enrollment crisis has roiled higher education in the United States, UNA's smart growth strategy of offering students the option of face-to-face, online, and hybrid instruction combined with its commitment to academic programs that support career-ready graduates and workforce development means that student enrollment is vibrant and growing.

Fall 2022 saw UNA enrollment top **10,000** for the first time ever. Spring 2023 marked UNA's 15th term of record enrollment. The innovative, dedicated Enrollment Management team positions UNA to build on its success.

- Student catalogs have been updated to better reflect UNA's workforce development programs, micro-credential offerings, and latest programs.
- Software updates allow for improved advising and registration of students.
- The Office of Admissions hosted 7,206 visitors to campus in 2022 as part of its commitment to engage prospective students and their families—a 26 percent increase over 2021.
- Admissions staff visited almost 700 high schools, programs, and college fairs in 2022.
- The Office of Admissions hosted 118 group tours/presentations on campus.







UNIQUE SCHOLARSHIP **OPPORTUNITIES**

UNA's unique scholarship offerings allow the University to recruit outstanding students at all levels while maintaining its commitment to workforce development and graduating career-ready individuals to lead the state and region into the future.

- Scholarships of Distinction provide funding and excellent learning experiences for students majoring in Accounting, Computer Science, Computer Information Systems, Data Analytics, Engineering Technology, Occupational Health Science, and Information Technology.
- Corporate Partner Employee scholarships support our UNA partners in private sector businesses, health systems, school districts, government, professional associations, and other organizations by offering their employees a tuition scholarship.
- The LEAD Partnership allows school system employees in UNA's LEAD partner districts to obtain an advanced degree, certification, and/or micro-credential from UNA in an online format at a reduced cost.
- New Start scholarships offer students enrolled in any online bachelor's degree, graduate program (online or on-campus), certificate, or micro-credential a waived application fee and a complimentary first course when enrolled in two or more courses — allowing many individuals the opportunity to return to higher education.
- The LEAD Partnership High School Senior scholarship is awarded to one graduating senior from each of UNA's LEAD partner districts, and priority is given to a student pursuing education as their field of study.
- The Military Heroes scholarship is offered to any active duty service member or veteran of the U.S. Military, current National Guard or Reserves members, and/ or their spouses. Students must enroll in an online bachelor's degree, graduate program (online or on campus), certificate, or micro-credential to qualify, and this scholarship is need-based.
- The Presidential Mentors Academy program offers annual scholarships to underrepresented and underserved students throughout their time at UNA. Recipients receive financial assistance, leadership development training, peer mentoring, and academic advising.
