Priority Deadline



The 2026-2027 Housing Application Priority Deadline for New Residents is March 1st.

Roommates



Students can create Roommate Groups within their UNA Housing Portal.

Building Assignments



New students applying before March 1st will receive their hall assignment by May 31st.



Freshmen Live on Requirement

Freshmen are required to live on campus for one academic year.

Students eligible for exemption must submit an online exemption form. If you are requesting a residency exemption, you are encouraged to submit a form upon admission to the university.



Housing Exemption forms are available within the same portal as the UNA Housing Application.

Advising and Registration

At UNA, we want to create a personalized advising process that allows students to sign up for classes as soon as their cohort registration is available. Meet with your advisor in person or online to pre-select your schedule so you're ready to register long before orientation.

-  **Personalized, individual advising**
Consideration for AP/Dual Enrollment, student involvement, and special courses
-  **Remote options for students and families**
Meet online or in person - no requirement to travel to campus for advising. Choose the best option for your time and needs
-  **No holds or blocks on registration**
Advising and registration can occur before orientation. Arrive to ROAR with a schedule so you can focus on other points of information

Placement and Prior Credit

ACT/SAT

- Subject scores determine course placement
- Score is not included on high school transcript, must be sent from student's MyACT Account
- Some subjects offer placement tests: English, Math

AP Credit

- Qualifying scores will count as college course credit
- Score report submitted to UNA by student from College Board

Dual Enrollment

- Courses will count toward college credit/degree requirements
- Need official high school transcript AND official transcript from college where credit was taken
- Early College courses taken at UNA are already applied

Pre-Advising Checklist

Being prepared for your academic advisement session is key to your success. You must meet with an advisor before you can register for class.

1. Get Logged In

- UNA email & password are provided in your acceptance letter.
- Set up DUO & Microsoft Outlook on your phone.

2. Access UNA Portal

- Sign your financial responsibility agreement and review financial information.
- Review your Academic Profile and Degree Works to verify major and credit articulation.

3. Register for Classes

- Schedule your advising appointment.
- Schedule placement tests if needed.
