Faculty Spotlight:

Dr. Tammy Winner, Associate Professor of English



COAS Associate Professor of English within the Professional Writing program, Dr. Tammy Winner, completed a 10-week Faculty Fellowship this summer at NASA Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville, AL. Dr. Winner was encouraged to join the Technology Transfer Team as a technical writer. Her research this summer focused on conducting floating observations on the

occupational gap some college students face when graduating from a university and entering into the workforce. Dr. Winner's research will be published in a white paper by NASA in November 2019. When asked about this experience she said, "It was great to step out of the classroom after 22 years and 'stretch' my brain in this way. I plan to transfer much of what I learned into my pedagogy at both the undergraduate and graduate Professional Writing classes I teach at UNA." Winner added, "It was especially interesting to be at NASA during the 50th celebration of the Apollo landing. She added, "we have so many UNA alumni working at NASA, I was excited to meet so many Lions while I was there!"

Dr. Winner's degrees in English and Professional/Technical Writing include: a Bachelor's of Science degree from West Virginia University, three Master's degrees (MBA, MEd, from Frostburg University and an MA in English from Carnegie Mellon), and a Ph.D. in Rhetoric from Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Her dissertation titled, "Teaching First-Year English Employing Web Based Pedagogies: A Qualitative Study" influenced the direction of her continued research in Multimodal Writing, Grant Writing and Technical Writing. She joined UNA in 2012 and is the current Program Coordinator of the MA in Writing Program, the Professional Writing internship Supervisor, and an advisory member of the HCI/UX Minor.

She is a coal miner's daughter from Frostburg, MD. When she isn't teaching at UNA or writing grants for Every Child Counts in Abaco, Bahamas, you can find her puttering in her garden or helping find a forever home for an animal in need.
