Packing For Necessity



- Before packing, consult the TSA website at http://www.tsa.gov/ for regulations on what you may have in your carry-on luggage.
- Carry-on luggage must conform to the size of overhead bins and space beneath the seat in front of you. Check airline websites for size requirements.
- What to have on you in the airport:
 - Basic survival: identification, insurance, cash, credit/debit cards, cell phone
 - Electronics
 - Copies of necessary information and travel info
 - Change of clothes, toothbrush & toothpaste, soap (optional)
 - Necessary medicine (prescriptions must be in original, labeled bottles)

Devices and Plug Adaptors



- A simple plug adaptor (available from Walmart or amazon.com) will typically allow you to use your laptop, smart phone and digital camera abroad. A Google search will help you identify the appropriate adaptor.
- Many small appliances (hair dryers, curling irons, rollers) are best purchased abroad, where they're typically inexpensive. An expensive and bulky transformer would be required to use your US appliance abroad.

Banking



 The easiest way to access your bank account abroad is by using your debit card. Advise your bank of your travel dates before departure. This will allow you to withdraw cash from an ATM machine. Most banks impose a \$5/transaction charge, plus 3% of the amount withdrawn, but this is far less expensive than cash conversions. Plus, it is not advisable to travel with large amounts of cash.

Calling Home



 Skype is, for most people, the least expensive and most practical means for calling home. Skype to Skype calls are free. For calls to landlines or mobile phones, you will need to set up a 'Skype Out' account.
