IV. What were the Committee's actions and accomplishments this year relative to each of the items of the charge?

Service – The DLAC serviced the university by providing the university with several recommendations. 1) Learning Management System – CANVAS 2) TEACH Act 3) Investigated the DL policy on Administering Exams-Verification of Student Identity 4) Policy/Statement revision relative to SACS Standard 4.8

Aid – The DLAC aided the university by providing the university with several ways to stay abreast of new DL trends and tools such as: 1) DLAC Annual Spring Conference 2) Lunch and Learn sessions and 3) Special DL topics through virtual conferences

Develop – The DLAC developed a couple of recommendations to the university that were approved. 1) Learning Management System Report – CANVAS and 2) TEACH Act Report

An investigation of the DL policy on Administering Exams-Verification of Student Identity resulted in to a concern about third party providers and how they play a role with identifying the student.

 - 2) Continue to promote distance learning consistency to the faculty as to how they set up their CANVAS webpage for the student.
 - 3) Continue to find better ways to identify and verify a student's ID when administering online exams in regards to third party providers.
- VII. What are the Committee's weaknesses?

I had a limited view of the committee; however, I did 'think' that there was a conflict with not having any Educational Technology Service staff as members on the committee. The ETS staff were my "go to" for information when I was chairing the committee. I am not sure if having the ETS staff on the committee is a conflict of interest but if it is not, then I recommend they be allowed to be a member.

The ETS staff have created templates that would help eliminate the confusion and would make resources such as the 'library link' easy to find because it will be in the same place every time the student views each one of his/her faculty persons Canvas webpage. This would eliminate frustration for the student and I personally believe, help with student retention.
