VII. SPECIAL BUSINESS

- Speaker Mayor Betterton

 - Chief of Staff Britton asks Mayor Betterton what his best advice would be for student leaders here on campus.

XIV. NEW BUSINESS

- Bill 24-18: Mandatory Training Removal Act
 - Senator McDonald is presenting the first bill on the Senate floor at this meeting.
 - Chairwoman Hamilton thinks it's a great idea. She thinks it is very well written.
 - Freshman Forum Advisor Anthony asks if this legislation was written regarding the new bill that was just passed.
 - Senator McDonald affirms the question. She says it was written in response to the bill that was passed.
 - Senator Gilliland moves to go into a vote. The motion was heard and properly seconded.
 - The Senate unanimously votes in favor of this bill. It passes.
- Bill 24-19: Trainings Removal Act
 - Senator Gilliland is presenting the second bill on the Senate floor at this meeting.
 - Senator Gilliland says that the purpose of this bill is to remove the mandatory portion of the training.
 - President Mardis knows that the training is important. However, they are just removing this portion in the Code of Laws first, then adding additional legislature to include training of some capacity.
 - Chairwoman Hamilton moves to go into a vote. The motion was heard and properly seconded.
 - The Senate unanimously votes in favor of this bill. It passes.
- Resolution for Dr. Roy S. Stevens
 - Senator Gilliland is also presenting the resolution for Dr. Roy S. Stevens.
 - President Mardis thinks this resolution is great, and that the Senate should pass it. She commends Senator Gilliland for all of his hard work, and for demonstrating initiative.
 - Chairman Holcombe moves to pass the resolution. The motion was heard and properly seconded.
 - The Senate unanimously votes in favor of this resolution. It passes.
- Kilby Halloween Sign-Ups

• The opportunity has been presented for Senate to sign up for an opportunity to hand out candy to the Kilby kids on Halloween! They will be coming to the office of Student Engagement.

XV. OPEN DISCUSSION

- Step Sing
 - Pro-Tempore Fitz would like to speak on Step Sing. She attended the Step Sing meeting earlier this week. This
 year, if you drop out after registering, you must pay a \$150 fine.
 - o There are no rules stating that your team can only consist of members from your own organization.
 - To keep our numbers from getting too low, and so we don't have to pay money, she proposes that we hold auditions for people not affiliated with Senate to participate in Step Sing.
 - Chief of Staff Britton says that as of right now, we are not even signed up to participate in Step Sing. She says that by opening up participation to students outside of SGA, we are allowing students to participate who may not have had an organization to participate in Step Sing with.
 - Senator Strait asks where the funding for props and costumes would come from.
 - o President Mardis thinks it could be beneficial to have a second vote within Senate.
 - The Senate believes that SGA should do Step Sing, and that we should include other students on the Step Sing team as well.
