X. CHAIR REPORTS

- Academic Affairs Chairwoman Winston
 - Their committee talked about restructuring Pride Points to make them clearer and more concise.

 - They are brainstorming some ideas for midterms and finals coming up in a few months.
- Budget Oversight Chairman Cantrell

XII. AD HOC COMMITTEES

- SGA 5k
 - Senator Hanback would like to thank everyone who has been involved in the process of helping with the SGA 5K.
 - They have laid the groundwork for this, and now they are preparing to begin the marketing for this event.

- Their two main objectives now are to find runners and find sponsorships for this event.
- Historian Plunkett is presenting what the sponsorship packet will look like to any business who would like to participate, as well as businesses she believes would be good places to contact.
- She has prepared a script for anyone who is going around to businesses asking for their participation in this event.
- Senator Gilliland asks if sponsors must be from the Florence area. Senator Joyner says that these sponsors can come from anywhere.
- President Mardis encourages everyone to go out next Saturday and ask businesses to sponsor the 5K!
- Senator Hardin asks if there is a specific timeline for that Saturday. Senator Joyner replies that they will be willing
 to work on the flexibility of timing so long as they can get participation in going around to businesses.
- Treasurer Batchelor has a few updates. Smile Bev. Co. declined to participate, but she is coordinating with Cheese and Chicks, as well as other sponsors. She is also coordinating with the Freshman Forum Outreach and Philanthropy committee.
- Senator Gilliland asks if there is a plan in place if the SGA 5K is rained out on the actual race day.
 - It has not been discussed yet, as of right now.
- Matthew says that the SGA 5K website is now up, and sponsors can be referred to the website to make their payments online.
- Chief of Staff Britton asks if churches can provide sponsorships, or if sponsorships are only just geared towards businesses. Sponsorships are open to everyone.

Parking

President Kitts responded to the memorandum that was sent to him. Core 4, Dr. White, and other important administration will be meeting with him to go over this.

XV. OPEN DISCUSSION

- "Did You Know?" Presentations
 - Chief of Staff Britton says that this is one of the ideas brought up during the executive council meeting earlier this
 week.
 - The idea behind these presentations is to inform the student body of facts about campus, scholarships, and other resources that they may not have already been aware of.
 - This is simple, engages our social media, and informs students about the opportunities available for them.
 - She proposes this idea to the Senate and asks for suggestions on this idea.
 - Pro-Tempore Fitz thinks this idea is fire.
 - Chairwoman Hamilton asks if all five committees would present a fact every week. Chief of Staff Britton replies that every committee would post a fact each week.
 - Freshman Forum Advisor Anthony tells the Senate that there are fourteen weeks left of school.
 - Senator Strait feels that doing all the facts in one Instagram post would be an information overload to students. She thinks they should be more spread out.
 - President Mardis encourages everyone to use facts that help students and cannot be found anywhere else (ex. the UNA website).
 - Senator Gilliland suggests posting one fact every day. Chief of Staff Britton replies that the Instagram algorithm does not particularly favor that format for marketing promotion.
 - Senator Vincent likes the idea of having each committee post each week.
 - The student forum offers their opinions on this idea.
 - One student says that she would not swipe through all the slides in one post.
 - Another student says that constantly posting facts every week may potentially crowd the Instagram feed.
 - Pro-Tempore Fitz says that if we choose to post stories instead of actual posts, we do not need to do a bunch of facts all at once.
 - There is a motion to go into a vote. The motion was heard and properly seconded.
 - We will be posting these facts once a week using Instagram stories.

Campus Wide Clean-Up

- A campus wide clean-up is another goal that we had created in the beginning of the year.
- The executive council decided that they would like to promote the FSL Campus Clean-Up on February 15.
- Senator McDonald thinks that this would put less stress on SGA to put on this event ourselves.
- Freshman Forum Advisor Anthony asks if Freshman Forum can participate. Vice-President McGinnis thinks this would be a great idea.

FDOC Event Discussion

• The executive council talked about how the FDOC Event went last week.

- We need feedback regarding this event and were thinking about potentially making this event bigger.
- Senator Joyner would like this event to be bigger! This would push the Senate to make this a mandatory event. Her only concern is senators forgetting to work their tables with it being the first event back on campus.
- Senator Hanback believes that making this event bigger could help with student engagement.
- Pro-Tempore Fitz proposes that we do a bigger event in the GUC, instead of the Lucky Dip. This is something that
 we could potentially think about.
- Senator Mwaura believes that we should do tables that are not in the academic buildings.
- Senator Gilliland believes that we could call the event The Lucky Sip (props to Matthew)!
- President Mardis reminds the Senate that the Lucky Dip takes a lot of planning. She wants everyone to keep in mind that we would need to have someone in charge of it, and they may not want to necessarily help plan it over winter break
- Pro-Tempore Fitz says that we can involve other organizations and complete the planning before the university closes for break.
- President Mardis and Senator Mwaura believes that this could be the responsibilities of potentially the Student Welfare committee, historian, or DIA.
